KEY VOCABULARY

Equality – The right of all people from all backgrounds to receive the same treatment

Equity - Emphasis is on actual fairness of outcomes: To achieve fair outcomes, sometimes people need to be treated differently to ensure their opportunities are the same as others

Diversity - The differences among humans, which can include gender, race, age, sexual orientation, and religious beliefs

Inclusion - The practice of taking action in order to provide equal access to opportunities for people who otherwise might be excluded

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Discussion Questions

- 1. President Biden has said he wants all individuals treated in a systematically fair, just, and impartial way. Do you agree?
- 2. Rodney Robinson believes that all students should receive a quality education that gives them the ability to become successful adults. Teachers alone can't do it all. They need help from others in shaping the young. Parents, administrators, politicians, and students themselves all have roles to play. Do you agree that all of these different people - not just teachers - should have a role in educating students and preparing them for the future?
- 3. How does the concept of *equity* differ from the concept of *equality*?
- 4. Have you ever seen a lack of equity in your own school experience? What effect did it have?
- 5. The United States is a racially and ethnically diverse country of more than 300 million people. What does diversity mean in the context of your country? Do you think creating equity for all is an issue in your country?
