## American Spaces Network in Chile Hosts Series of STEM Workshops to Combat Climate Change

The American Spaces networks in Talca, Santiago, Valdivia and Temuco, Chile, kicked-off their virtual three-week workshop series on July 25, 2023 focused on using robotics to combat climate change. By the end of the workshops, 128 students will learn how to use robotics to measure air quality and learn ways to combat the climate crisis through techniques they learn through the series.

# Expanding Opportunities with MOOCs in Burundi



### **Embassy Bujumbura's American Spaces Program Specialist** Jean de Dieu Nkurunziza conducted an outreach session at the University of Burundi to launch MOOC English courses. The social media engagement following the session was the highest of 2023 for their network, with more than 15,000 views. MOOC courses are popular with a large audience of Burundian youth who are struggling to receive English and computer

literacy training. Skills building programs not only grow short term people-to-people connections, but in the long term, can influence policy and shape the future of education systems and job creation.

For this month's issue, we are featuring speakers for **Hispanic Heritage Month (September 15 - October 15).** *Antonio Tijerino is* the president and CEO of the Hispanic Heritage Foundation (HHF), a nonprofit organization that works to increase the number of Latina and Latino leaders in the community, classroom, and workforce. Under Tijerino's leadership, HHF maintains a network of 150,000 Latinos aged 15-35 mobilized in areas such as STEM, tech, entrepreneurship, finance, and media. Tijerino also is the executive producer of the Hispanic Heritage Awards, and has been recognized by the White House, U.S. Congress, Fortune 500 companies, nonprofits, and the Government of Mexico. He is also fluent in Spanish.

## New Resources to View and Use


